#### RING ONE- START: 9AM JUDGE: MISS D CLAYTON

**Class 1. Ridden Walk & Trot-** Open to any height, age and type of horse/pony. Riders over the age of 14yrs. No cantering.

**Class 2. Mature Riders** Open to any height, age and type. Riders 45yrs and over but to be of suitable size for their mount. To be judged on the riders position, effectiveness and showmanship skills.

Class 3. Ridden Novice- Open to any height, age and type of horse/pony. Riders over the age of 14yrs. Combinations not to have won two 1st places in any showing competition. No Cantering in go round but is optional for the individual shows.

**Class 4. Ridden Coloured/Odd Coloured-** Open to Piebalds, Skewbalds, Blagdons, Spotteds, Duns, Buckskins, Roans and Palominos etc. Riders any age.

Class 5. Ridden Bays, Blacks, Greys, Chestnuts etc Open to all solid coloured horses, Riders any age.

### RING ONE- START: NOT BEFORE 1PM JUDGE: MISS D CLAYTON

Class 6. Ridden Cobs and Cob Type Open to any height. To be shown hogged and trimmed or in their natural state. Riders any age.

**Class 7. Ridden Mountain & Moorland** Open to registered & unregistered small and large breeds. To be shown unplaited. Will split Small and Large Breeds if entries warrant. Riders any age but to be of suitable size for their mount.

Class 8. Ridden Veteran Open to horses and ponies any type, aged 15yrs and over. Riders any age.

**Class 9. Ridden Rescue** Open to any rescue horse or pony, any height and type. Riders any age.

Class 10. Riding Club Horse/Pony Open to horses and ponies any age, height and type. Riders over 14yrs. To be judged on suitability to perform all riding club activities.

Class 11. Ridden Open- Open to any height, age and type of horse/pony. Riders any age. \*\*RIDDEN CHAMPIONSHIP\*\*

To take place on completion of all ring one classes. All 1st and 2nd place exhibits from classes 1-11 are invited to compete for the Ridden Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes.

#### RING TWO- START: 9.30 JUDGE: MISS C FOX

**Class 12. In Hand Miniature Horses and Shetlands** Open to any Registered and unregistered pure and part breds miniature horses or standard/miniature shetland ponies.

**Class 13. In Hand Youngstock** Open to yearlings, 2yrs and 3yr olds (no foals). Any height and type \*See rule on Stallions & Colts

**Class 14. In Hand Novice** Open to any age, height and type. Horses/ponies not to have won two 1st places in any showing competition.

Class 15. In Hand Rescue Open to any rescue horse or pony, any age, height and type.

Class 16. In Hand Veteran Open to horses and ponies any height/type, aged 15yrs and over.

# RING TWO- START: NOT BEFORE 1PM JUDGE: MISS C FOX

**Class 17. In Hand Mountain & Moorland** Open to registered & unregistered small and large breeds. To be shown unplaited. Will split Small and Large Breeds if entries warrant.

Class 18. In Hand Cobs/Cob Type Open to any age and height. To be shown hogged and trimmed or in their natural state.

Class 19. In Hand Bays, Blacks, Greys, Chestnuts etc Open to all solid coloured horses, any age, height and type.

**Class 20. In Hand Coloured/Odd Coloured** Open to Piebalds, Skewbalds, Blagdons, Spotteds, Duns, Buckskins, Roans and Palominos etc. Any age, height and type.

Class 21. In Hand Open Open to all types, heights and ages.

\*\*IN HAND CHAMPIONSHIP\*\*- To take place on completion of all ring two classes. All 1st and 2nd place exhibits from classes 12-21 are invited to compete for the In Hand Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes.

# RING THREE- START: 1PM JUDGE: MISS L GOODERHAM

Class 22. Tiny Tots Lead Rein Open to Ponies 12hh and under, Riders 6yrs and under. To be judged on suitability as a small child's lead rein pony. Lead reins must be attached to the noseband and NOT the bit.

Class 23. Lead Rein Open to Ponies 12.2hh and under Riders 10yrs and under. Lead reins must be attached to the noseband and NOT the bit.

Class 24. Walk & Trot Open to any height, age and type. Riders 14yrs and under. No cantering.

**Class 25. Novice Ridden** Open to any height, age and type. Riders 14yrs and under. Combination not to have won two 1st places in any showing competition. No Cantering in go round but is optional for the individual shows.

Class 26. Open Junior Ridden Open to any height, age and type. Riders 14yrs and under.

**Class 27. Pony Club/Riding Club Pony** Open to ponies 14.2hh and under. Riders 14yrs and under. To be judged on suitability to perform all pony club activities.

**Class 28. Junior Handler** Open to any height, age and type. To be shown in hand. Handlers 14yrs and under. To be judged on the correct handling, effectiveness and showmanship skills of the handler.

\*\*JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIP\*\*- To take place on completion of all ring three classes. All 1st and 2nd place exhibits from classes 22-28 are invited to compete for the Junior Ring Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes.

Class FD. Fancy Dress Open to all ages, heights and types. Open to Ridden, In Hand and Lead Reins. Class will only be required to walk round as a group (no trotting or cantering) Entrants may be asked to stand out in front of the judge individually for a closer inspection. To be judged on the creativity and overall impression of costume.

#### **RULES**

- 1. The organisers have taken all reasonable precautions to ensure the Health and Safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and stewards.
- 2. The judge's decision is final. Any objections must be made in writing to the Show Secretary within 30minutes of the cause and be accompanied by a £20.00 deposit refundable only if the objection is upheld.
- 3. The organisers reserve the right to refuse any entry or amend the schedule. The organisers will not tolerate disruptive behaviour from horses or riders.
- 4. Suffolk Riding Club shall not be liable for any claim in respect of damage, loss, injury or accident to any person, horse or property howsoever caused in connection with or arising out of this show. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that each entrant shall agree to indemnify the Suffolk Riding Club or any person acting on their behalf against any legal action arising from such an incident.
- 5. **HEADWEAR** Properly secured protective headwear must be worn when mounted. Hats must be to one of the following standards: PAS015:2011, VG 01.040: 2014-12 and must bear the BSI Kitemark, ASTM F1163:2004a or 04a onwards provided they SEI marked; SNELL E2016; AS/NZS 3838: 2006 Provided they are SAI Global marked.
- 6. We recommend the use of Back Protectors.
- 7. Children aged 16 years and under must wear protective headgear to standard for all in-hand and ridden classes.
- 8. SRC recommends all competitors wear protective headgear to standard for in hand classes.
- 9. No visible jewellery allowed.
- 10. All horses & ponies must be 4 years old or over to compete in ridden classes.
- 11. No person shall allow a **stallion** for which he/she is responsible for as an owner, leasee, authorised agent or rider to compete or be prepared to compete, in any competitions without taking adequate precautions to ensure that other members of the public are not put at risk of injury.
- 12. Stallions & Colts over 1yr MUST be bitted and must NOT be ridden or handled by children under the age of 16yrs.
- 13. Stallions & Colts to wear a Stallion/Colt bridle disk.
- 14. We politely ask for ANY horse or pony that may have a tendency to buck or kick out to wear a red ribbon in the tail to warn others of the potential risk.
- 15. Mountain and Moorland ponies entering other classes will be accepted unplaited.
- 16. No trotting or cantering in public areas only in "working in" arenas. Tethering is not allowed.
- 17. Do not obstruct the access emergency services must have access to all parts of the event at all times.
- 18. Bicycles, Scooters, Ball Games etc. are not allowed on this show ground. Spectators with umbrellas, prams/buggies/push-chairs must take extreme care & keep them well away from the horses/ponies.
- 19. Small children must be accompanied at all times.
- 20. Competitors MUST hold adequate insurance cover including public liability insurance.
- 21. Well behaved dogs are welcome but must be kept under control and remain on a short lead.
- 22. All dog poo MUST be bagged up and disposed of in the rubbish bins provided.
- 23. We politely ask for you to take home all rubbish with you and not to skip out in the lorry park, please pick up all droppings from your parking area and take home with you as livestock regularly graze the land.
